# Visby Programme – scholarships for exchange studies in Sweden

The Swedish Institute offers exchange students from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Russian and Ukraine the opportunity to apply for scholarships for studies for one or two semesters in Sweden in any field.

## Who can apply?

Students who have been nominated for exchange studies in Sweden may apply.

The applicant should be a citizen of and currently living either in Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova, Russia or Ukraine.

Applicants who have lived in Sweden for two or more years are not eligible to apply.

## Any field

Scholarships can be applied for studies in any field, provided that the courses are approved within the exchange agreement between the university in the home country and in Sweden.

The courses can be taught in Swedish or English language.

## Scholarship offer

The scholarship is only valid for full time studies (30 ECTS) in Sweden for one or two semesters.

The scholarship is tax free, and consists of a monthly stipend of SEK 9 000. This sum is meant to cover living costs, local travel during the visit and study materials. Insurance is also included in the scholarship. The scholarship also includes a travel grant of SEK 5 000.

## Application period and process

The applicant must first contact the international office or secretariat at the university in their home country, for information regarding the application for exchange studies.

Once the applicant has been nominated for exchange studies, he/she can apply for a scholarship from the Swedish Institute. The scholarship application must be supported by an exchange agreement stating that the student does not have to pay tuition fees for the studies in Sweden.

The call for applications takes place during the spring for visits beginning in the autumn, preliminary between 15 March to 30 April. Applications are made online via SI:s application portal.
