About Blu-ray

Blu-ray is a disc that looks like a CD / DVD but contains 5–10 times more data than a DVD. You need a Blu-ray player (regular DVD player does not work) that can be used in many types of venues; from real movie theaters to community centres of various kinds.

Audio and video on the discs correspond to full HD (1920 x 1080 pixels) and the sound is Dolby 5.1 multichannel stereo. The films will perform at their best when these technical requirements are available in the screening location.

If you don't have a Blu-ray player, it can be bought for less than 50 EUR in electronic stores and online.

DCP format

For screening in really big and professional theatres you should contact SI for help with receiving an even more high definition format than Blu-ray, normally called Digital Cinema Package (DCP).

Test run

We strongly recommend to always pre-screen the films at least two weeks before an event to verify that everything looks good. Small variations in technique always occur in different parts of the world even if the main technical requirements are met. Sometimes noise levels and speaker system need to be tuned.
