

## **Technical information**

### **DCP format**

For screenings in cinema theatres and large auditoriums you should order the films as DCP (Digital Cinema Package) from SI. DCP is a modern, secure and reliable high definition format for movies. It's also a worldwide technical standard. In the near future, DCPs will be delivered as files for download, but currently the film is normally stored on small computer hard drives and couriered to the place for the screening, where the files are copied into the cinema's server system.

### **About Blu-ray**

Blu-ray is a digital optical disc capable of storing high-definition (HD) video resolution. You need a Blu-ray player (regular DVD player does not work) that can be used in different venues, from real movie theatres to community centres, et cetera. Audio and video on the discs correspond to full HD (1920 x 1080 pixels) and the sound is Dolby 5.1 multichannel stereo. The films will perform at their best when these technical requirements are available in the screening location. If you don't have a Blu-ray player, it can be bought in electronic stores and online.

### **Test run**

We strongly recommend pre-screening the films at least two weeks before an event to verify that everything looks and sounds as it should. Small technical variations occur in different parts of the world even if the main technical requirements are met. Sometimes noise levels and speaker systems need to be tuned.
